The successful candidate will be expected to establish an integrated, nationally recognized teaching, research, and outreach program in agricultural health and safety. The successful candidate is expected to:

- develop a nationally recognized program as evidenced by peer-reviewed scholarly work;
- attract external funding to support outreach and applied research, including funding of graduate students;
- demonstrate commitment and ability to work with teams of faculty on interdisciplinary problems;
- create a proactive, high-impact extension program that supplies clientele with relevant, state-ofthe-art informational content;
- recruit and direct MS and PhD graduate students;
- contribute to the multi-functional land-grant mission of the department through outreach and engagement efforts with community stakeholders.

Qualifications include:

- a Ph.D. in an appropriate field with an emphasis on agricultural health and safety;
- the ability to conduct high-level independent research and oversee graduate student research;
- ability to conceive and implement training and information programs for both technical and nontechnical audiences; and
- demonstration of outstanding written and verbal communication skills.
